Days & Times/ Attendance

Sunday Mornings 9:30-12:00

Consistent and timely attendance is vital! Please make Hebrew School is a priority and impart this sense to your children in unequivocal terms.

Please schedule parties, play dates, sports activities and meetings after Hebrew School is over.

Arrivals

Drop off is at the entrance at the front of the building. Drive up to the front and a staff member will be there to greet you and your child. If you'd like to walk your child in, please park in the back parking lot to allow traffic flow. Please be punctual and limit late arrivals to emergency situations. It is difficult for a child to come to school when class has already begun. The initial welcome period allows for your child to settle in to the routine of the day

Pickup

We ask that you park in the back of the building and walk to the front entrance to pick up your child. Please do not park in the front as this clogs up the driveway and does not allow for traffic flow.

Informing of Absence/ Changes

Please remember to inform the school if your child will be absent from school for any reason.

Emergency School Cancellations

In the event of inclement weather, parents will be notified by email (and phone if necessary) if Hebrew School has been canceled.

Parent-Teacher Rapport is extremely important. Our School is run by a staff of dedicated teachers. Each of them spends hours planning their lessons and designing creative methods of teaching. They are deeply concerned about the progress of each student and would be happy to discuss your child's progress with you. Please call our office and we will make arrangements for you to speak with your child's teacher.

Guidance/Discipline

The Chabad Hebrew School strives to create an atmosphere that reflects our Jewish values. We take pride in our student body who respect teachers, fellow students, and the property of school.

We expect each student to:

- Be courteous to fellow students and staff members
- Follow classroom directions
- Complete class assignments and homework

We use incentives to encourage the children to participate and interact in a positive manner.

Snack

Snacks and drinks are provided by the school. Please avoid sending any food to school. **Sponsors of \$36 are welcomed**, so that we can maintain our healthy snack program. Please email mimi@chabadplace.org if you'd like to be a snack sponsor.

Safety

Safety is of primary importance. Minor bumps, scrapes or bruises will be cared for by the school staff.

In case of a serious medical emergency, G-d forbid, parents, family doctor and emergency responders will be contacted immediately. If, however, we cannot reach you or your doctor immediately we will use our best judgment on behalf of your child.

Special Conditions

If your child has any special challenges or conditions (i.e. social, behavioral), the knowledge of which would help us in caring for them and maximizing their potential, please bring them to our attention. (Please note that this information will be kept confidential.)

Dress Code & Supplies

Kippa

Boys are encouraged to wear a kippa at all times. We recommend that each boy bring their own kippa and keep it stored in their backpack. For those who do not, we will supply one at school.

Tzedakah/ Charity

Tzedakah - charity is an important part of our curriculum, and we encourage students to bring a coin every Sunday to help fill up the class Tzedaka Box. As their boxes fill, they will have the opportunity to count it and discuss where to appropriate the money.

Backpacks & Supplies

We provide an exclusive Hebrew School backpack, books, supplies and a Hebrew School folder with an Aleph Bet chart. The only items which should be brought to school are the backpack and its contents. Please ensure that ALL Hebrew School papers and homework are returned to their folders as soon as you have completed reviewing the contents so that nothing is missing when they return to class.

Jewish Lending Library

Children will be allowed to borrow Jewish books for one week duration. Books are to be returned in the same condition in which they were received. If books are damaged beyond normal wear, parents will be responsible to pay for a replacement book (and keep the damaged one if desired.)

Lost Supplies

A \$5 charge for lost Aleph Champ Books or backpack will be assessed.

Personal Belongings

Students up to through are not permitted to bring CELL PHONES, i-pods, electronic gadgets or any dangerous objects to School. In the event that a student brings them or any other materials we deem inappropriate for learning, the teacher will hold it for safekeeping and will return it to the parents at the end of the day. We respectfully request, that parents take the lead in enforcing this rule and not put the administration in an uncomfortable position.

How to Help your Child Succeed

In order for our Hebrew School program to be most effective, the home and school must work hand in hand to promote a close relationship. The following are a few suggestions to aid you in allowing this to happen.

- A growing child needs plenty of rest. Set a reasonable bed time the night before a school day.
- Many of our students are involved in other extra-curricular activities (e.g. sports, music, etc.). All
 these are important; however please make your child's Jewish education a priority.
- There is a direct correlation between a student's attendance, and his/her interest, achievement and attitude. Every time your child is absent, there is a loss of continuity to the program. Keep your child in school regularly.
- Please help your child come to Hebrew School on time.
- The place to voice your concerns of the school is with the school director and teacher <u>in</u> private. Please do not discuss school issues in the presence of your child.
- Participation in synagogue services and celebration of Jewish holidays will greatly enhance
 your child's interest in Judaism and strengthen his/her Jewish identity. Our director and
 teachers are always willing to provide resources, share their expertise, and help out however
 possible.
- Show your child that you are interested in his/her Jewish education. Spend time with your child reviewing what he/she has learned in class and listening to him/her read Hebrew to you. This will greatly encourage and help foster a strong and positive identity.
